On Saturday, Hon Marama Davidson, Minister for Prevention of Family and Sexual Violence, Hon Priyanca Radhakrishnan, Minister for Disability Issues and Associate Minister for Social Development and Employment, jointly announced the Budget 2023 family violence and sexual violence.

## Budget 2023 – addressing gaps, improving outcomes, maintaining momentum

The family violence sector is getting \$73.48 million in funding for 10 initiatives across the family violence and sexual violence sector in Budget 2023 funding.

Budget Day is this Thursday, but as with the last few years, the Government has announced its family violence and sexual violence funding as an early, pre-Budget, announcement.

In addition to the funding that will benefit children and young people, disabled people and tangata whenua, Budget 2023 funds and reinforces the priorities of Te Aorerekura, the National Strategy to Eliminate Family Violence and Sexual Violence.

National Hui – now less than a month away!



The Annual Te Aorerekura Hui will take place in Whanganui-a-Tara Wellington on Wednesday 14 June. It's going to be a hybrid event, with an in-person stream to enable broader participation.

The Hui is focused on ako tahi – how we learn together and how we monitor progress in implementing <u>Te Aorerekura- the National Strategy to Eliminate Family</u> <u>Violence and Sexual Violence</u>.

It will bring together tangata whenua leaders, specialists from the family violence and sexual violence sectors, and people from across our communities, with government officials and Ministers.
